A guide coat is a thin mist of colour applied over high build primer and then wet flatted off. Initial sanding will remove the high points, and it is only when the whole of the guide coat has been removed that the high points of the panel will be level with the low points - then the surface will be

This operation removes any surface oxidation and opens up the primer to accept the next coat. Apply the second coat of primer the same way you applied the first, but this time you will notice
