10.1.3 - Organization of the Periodic Table

As the number of known elements grew, so did the need to organize them into groups based on their properties. In 1789, French chemist Antoine Lavoisier (la VWAHzee ay) grouped the known elements into categories he called metals, nonmetals, gases, and earths. For the next 80 years, scientists looked for different ways to classify the elements.
