The most common square foot gardening raised bed is a wooden frame that is 4 feet by 4 feet (4 feet by 8 feet is also another commonly used size). This is divided into 1-foot squares, giving 16 square feet in total. The square foot lattice actually helps by visually separating each crop. The depth of bed should be at least 6 to 12 inches deep.
